INDIAN EDUCATION ACT FUNDS \$9.75M

NATIVE AMERICAN EDUCATION \$10.25M

Recurring non-competitive grants to improve academic and cultural achievement opportunities; to develop and implement educational blueprints and governance structures; collaborate with school districts to plan and deliver community-based education programs and social support services for Native American students; Indian Education Division operations; and fund Native American teacher pathways.

Recurring funds for Native American students, tribal education departments, and higher education institutions to provide strategic solutions focused on shared responsibility and support tribal education sovereignty; support community-based education in tribal communities; deliver a balanced, culturally and linguistically relevant education that serve Native youth holistically to ensure success in life, college, and career.

INDIAN EDUCATION ACT GRANTS

- NA student count: Tribes, Nation, Pueblos – 43,181; School District – 40,341
- Priorities: (1) College, Career, and Life Readiness; (2) Culturally and Linguistically Relevant Education & Social Emotional Learning; (3) Culture and Identity Development; (4) Increasing Access to Native American Language Programs



IE BLUEPRINTS & GOVERNANCE STRUCTURES

- NA student count: Tribes, Nation, Pueblos: 43,181
- 3-year agreements with Tribes, Nation, Pueblos FY21-23
- Priorities: deliver a plan of action from pre-K to post-secondary, social and emotional support programs and services, establish and/or enhance existing community-based educational programs.



INDIGENOUS EDUCATION INITIATIVE

- Support schools in need of improvement with Indigenous school design, including:
- Incorporating school and family engagement into school and district design.
 - Professional development for aspiring principals, teachers, and administrators
 - Tribal partnerships
 - Locally developed Indigenous curriculum
 - Evaluation and technical assistance



NATIVE AMERICAN LANGUAGE PROGRAMS

Supporting innovative, effective instruction in tribally-based Native American language programs to include curriculum development, assessments, recruitment and training of teachers, and program evaluation.



INDIAN EDUCATION ACT

- Review Native American serving school districts and state-funded programs on the implementation of the IEA.
- Provide technical support to LEAs, and TEDs.
- Convene semi-annual government to government meetings.



NA LANGUAGE & CULTURE EDUCATOR PATHWAY

- Establish a teacher pathway for native language teachers
- Keres Children Learning Center
 - University of New Mexico
 - Diné College
 - Pueblo of Jemez



INDIGENOUS LANGUAGE FELLOWS

Fund 100 Indigenous Language Fellows to learn their language in partnership with tribes and urban Native American Organizations.



NATIVE LANGUAGE DATA BASE

Create a database (e.g. UNESCO and Ethnologue) to track the progress and status of Indigenous languages with input from tribes.



COMMUNITY-BASED IMMERSION SCHOOL

Provide supplemental funding to community-based bilingual programs and track outcomes.



GROW YOUR OWN INDIGENOUS EDUCATOR PATHWAY


Establish an Indigenous Educator pathway grant program focused on recruitment and retention.


